Scope of this privacy notice

This privacy notice applies only to the actions of NESL and Users with respect to the services provided by us. It does not extend to any other services or websites that can be accessed from our website including any links we may provide to social media websites.

How we use your Data

We collect and process information with the aim of understanding your needs and in order to provide you with our goods and services. In particular we collect and process your data for the following reasons:

1. When you buy services from us, we will ask you for information in order to allow us to fulfil the contract.
2. To carry out our obligations arising from any purchases you make which includes but is not limited to, the performance of post-sales services, administration of orders and accounts and handling of complaints.
3. To provide you with information about current or other services that we may offer from time to time and are similar to those that you have already purchased or enquired about. This will only apply if you have opted in to receive marketing material from NESL. You can unsubscribe at any time using the unsubscribe link on the email
4. We may use your data to contact you for market research purposes to help us understand how we can improve our services to you.

What personal data do we collect?

Through our contact channels, we may collect the following information from you:

- Name, Job title, Profession;
- Contact information such as email addresses and telephone numbers;
- Demographic information such as post code
- IP address (automatically collected);
- Web browser type and version (automatically collected);
- Operating system (automatically collected);
- A list of URLs starting with a referring site, your activity on this Web Site, and the site you exit to (automatically collected).

Our legal basis for processing your data

We are required to advise you of our legal basis for processing your data. We collect and use our customers' personal data because it is necessary for:

- the purposes of performance of a contract for the sale of services (to which you are party) or in order to take steps at your request prior to entering into a contract
- the pursuit of our legitimate interests (as set out below) or;
- to comply with our legal obligations.

We may also seek your consent for processing and if we do, you have the right to withdraw this at any time.

Our legitimate interests

We have a legitimate interest to process your personal data in order to fulfil the following:

- selling and supplying services;
- protecting customers, employees and other individuals and maintaining their safety, health and welfare;
- promoting, marketing and advertising our products and services;
- understanding our customers' behaviour, activities, preferences, and needs;
- improving and developing products and services;
- complying with our legal and regulatory obligations;
- handling customer contacts, queries, complaints or disputes;
- protecting NESL, its employees and customers, by taking appropriate legal action against third parties who have committed criminal acts or are in breach of legal obligations.
- effectively handling any legal claims or regulatory enforcement actions taken against us
- fulfilling our duties to our customers, colleagues, and other stakeholders.

How we ensure your privacy is maintained

All information you provide to us is stored on our secure servers which are located within the UK.

Unfortunately, the transmission of information via the internet is not completely secure. Although we will do our best to protect your personal data, we cannot guarantee the security of your data transmitted to our site; any transmission is at your own risk. Once we have received your information, we will use strict procedures and security features to try to prevent unauthorised access.

We are committed to ensuring that your information is secure. To prevent unauthorised access or disclosure, we have put in place suitable physical, electronic and managerial procedures to safeguard and secure the information we collect online.

Providing your personal data to others

No other third parties have access to your personal data unless it is specifically required to meet either contractual obligations.

We do not disclose personal information about individuals to advertisers or sell your information to any other organisation for marketing or any other purposes.

Your legal rights relating to your personal data

You have a number of rights over your data as covered by data protection law. We have produced a short summary of these rights (below) however full details can be found by visiting the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) via www.ICO.gov.uk

- the right to be informed; before we begin processing your data, we will tell you what we need, why we need it and what we intend to do with it.
- the right of access; You have the right to ask us to provide you with the data we hold about you. This is usually completed via a Subject Access Request.

- the right to rectification; You have the right to have any inaccurate personal data about you rectified and, taking into account the purposes of the processing, to have any incomplete personal data about you completed.
- the right to erasure; In certain instances, you have the right to have your data erased without undue delay. There are however a number of exclusions and details of which can be found by contacting the ICO.
- the right to restrict processing; In certain instances, you have the right to restrict the processing of your personal data. However, there are a number of exclusions and details of which can be found by contacting the ICO.
- the right to object to processing; In certain instances, you have the right to object to our processing of your personal data on grounds relating to your particular situation. There are however a number of exclusions and details of which can be found by contacting the ICO.
- the right to data portability; You have the right to ask us to provide you with the data we hold about you. Where appropriate, we will provide this to you in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format. This right does not apply where it would adversely affect the rights and freedoms of others.
- rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling. If we undertake these activities using your data, we will adopt suitable procedures and you have the right to understand and challenge these.

Retention of your data

We will not retain your data for longer than necessary for the purposes set out in this notice. Different retention periods apply for different types of data. Data retention periods maybe legally imposed upon us or we may need to retain data to protect the vital interests of you or another natural person. In general terms, NESL will only retain your information and for a period of 24 months after the last transaction date upon which all personal data will be deleted from our systems.

Changes of Business Ownership and Control

We may, from time to time, expand or reduce our business and this may involve the sale and/or the transfer of control of all or part of NESL. Data provided by Users will, where it is relevant to any part of our business so transferred, be transferred along with that part and the new owner or newly controlling party will, under the terms of this privacy notice, be permitted to use the data for the purposes for which it was originally supplied to us. We may also disclose data to a prospective purchaser of our business or any part of it.

In the above instances, we will take steps with the aim of ensuring your privacy is protected.

General

You may not transfer any of your rights under this privacy notice to any other person. We may transfer our rights under this privacy notice where we reasonably believe your rights will not be affected.

If any court or competent authority finds that any provision of this privacy notice (or part of any provision) is invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that provision or part-provision will, to the extent required, be deemed to be deleted, and the validity and enforceability of the other provisions of this privacy notice will not be affected.

Unless otherwise agreed, no delay, act or omission by a party in exercising any right or remedy will be deemed a waiver of that, or any other, right or remedy.

This Agreement will be governed by and interpreted according to the law of England and Wales. All disputes arising under the Agreement will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English and Welsh courts.

Changes to this privacy notice

We keep our privacy notice under regular review. We reserve the right to change this privacy notice as we may deem necessary from time to time or as may be required by law. Any changes will be immediately posted on the Website and you are deemed to have accepted the terms of the privacy notice on your first use of the Website following the alterations.
